## **Head of Learning Area – Health & Physical Education**

CBC Fremantle is a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice tradition for boys in Years 7-12. The successful applicant will be the Team Leader of the Health & Physical Education Learning Area. The Head of Learning Area – Health & PE has a special responsibility for ensuring that the College Health & PE program is effectively managed and delivered. This role is undertaken in conjunction with the Principal, the Deputy Principal (Teaching and Learning) and other key staff.

### **Key Selection Criteria**

*The successful applicant will:*

- give witness to their personal faith and commitment by integrating a Catholic vision in all areas of their responsibility
- possess or be willing to complete all of the requirements for *Accreditation to Teach in a Catholic School*
- be willing to become an active member of the CBC Fremantle community with a strong commitment to promoting and supporting the boys' journey at the College
- lead, model and coach best practice in the design, delivery and assessment of the Health & Physical Education curriculum and have an understanding of the nuances of teaching boys' education context
- clearly exhibit leadership characteristics including competence, collaboration, intrinsic motivation, integrity and vision
- A commitment to the promotion of personal best and academic excellence

- have well developed written and oral communication skills, excellent interpersonal skills and able to work cooperatively as part of a team

### **Key Responsibilities**

The Head of Health & Physical Education will:

- be prepared to work closely with the Principal and staff to ensure that CBC Fremantle authentically reflects the mission of a Catholic school in the Edmund Rice Tradition
- undertake ongoing formation with Edmund Rice Education Australia (EREA) as required by the College
- be a member of, and actively contribute to the College Academic Board
- provide clear and competent leadership for all teachers of Health, Physical Education and Outdoor Education at the College
- to promote the harmonious interactions of members of the Health & PE Learning Area, both within a team and across the College as a whole
- ensure that all Health & PE teachers plan and deliver effective learning programs
- to set up and maintain teaching programs and marks books on SEQTA
- ensure that all requirements and deadlines pertaining to assessment and reporting are met by members of the Health & PE Learning Area
- to set a high standard of teaching and learning by example
- to develop and promote explicit and effective teaching and learning techniques within the Learning Area
- to assist the Deputy Principals with the tracking and monitoring of student academic and wellbeing progress
- to oversee the selection of prize-winners within the Learning Area
- to implement and oversee effective study and exam preparation strategies that promote and support academic excellence of Health, Physical and Outdoor Education at the College
- To ensure appropriate communication with parents, e.g. parent-teacher-student meetings, SEQTA, or by written or telephone communication
- provide support, assistance and mentoring to all Health & PE staff, including new and beginning teachers in the Learning Area at the College
- work with the Deputy Principal (Teaching and Learning) and other key staff to effectively manage the performance of all those in the Health & PE Learning Area
- conduct regular meetings of the Health & PE Learning Area
- be aware of Health, Physical and Outdoor Education curriculum developments at a local and national level and incorporate appropriate responses to these at a school level
- provide an engaging and vibrant learning environment at the College by promoting Health & PE activities and competitions as appropriate
- to represent the College at suitable meetings and conferences relevant to the Health & PE Learning Area
- To assist in the selection and appointment of new staff
- ensure that the College policy on the *Appropriate Selection of Texts* is observed

- manage the existing resources of the Health & PE Learning Area
- prepare and submit the annual budget for the Health & PE Learning Area
- undertake any other duties as reasonably required by the Principal

## **Position Details**

- 0.8 Teaching Load.
- A Level 1 monetary allowance is applicable to this position.
- The contract of employment is for a term of eight years subject to successful reviews during the third and seventh years. At the conclusion of the eight year period, the position will be advertised with the incumbent welcome to re-apply. An ongoing teaching position at the College is assured.
